ILLINOIS STATE SCHOLARS CLASS OF 2024

In order to enter the <u>Illinois State Scholars</u> competition, high school students must take the ACT and/or the SAT I college entrance exam in their junior year of high school and have the scores sent to ISAC. Approximately 10% of Illinois high school seniors are designated State Scholars and receive a Certificate of Achievement for the accomplishment. As part of this honor, JWCC offers each student a scholarship worth \$500 to be used toward furthering their education at JWCC. This is a one time award to be applied to the fall semester at JWCC.
