Individual, in-person interviews must be completed before Feb. 20

OPPORTUNITY

Students will compete for three (3) two-year, full in-district tuition Presidential Scholarships at John Wood Community College. Scholarships sponsored by the JWCC Foundation. Students with at least a 3.5 GPA (cumulative unweighted on 4.0 scale) are encouraged to apply.

The competition has three steps.

- 1. Visit jwcc.edu/presidential to apply for the scholarship. You will need the following to apply:
 - > Current high school transcript.
 - > Resume detailing community service and leadership.
 - Essay "How have you been a Trail Blazer and contributed to improving your school, community, or family?
- 2. Complete an admissions application to JWCC. Visit jwcc.edu/apply

3. In-person interview

Students with the top 10 application scores will be invited for an interview process with JWCC Foundation, Student Affairs, and Instruction representatives.

Questions will cover the student's interest in JWCC, community service, how they can be an ambassador for JWCC with alumni and the greater community, and how their values connect with those of the College.

SCORING - 100 POINTS

GPA - 20 points Resume - 10 points Essay - 20 points Interview - 50 points

Students have the incredible opportunity to connect with JWCC professors who are practicing attorneys, CEOs, expert nurses, professional musicians and published authors.

TRANSFERABILITY

John Wood students have successfully transferred to more than 100 colleges and universities nationwide. Students who have identified their transfer institution work with JWCC academic advisors to ensure all courses match with the school to which they plan to transfer. Those who are uncertain of a career path or transfer institution work with academic advisors to identify a career pathway and take general education courses that transfer to four-year schools.
